Baptising In the Jordan

We know from our Gospels that Jesus was baptised by St John. This was not in some nice ornate font but in the River Jordan. If you are lucky enough to go to the Holy Land there are a number of sites along the river that claim to be the place where Jesus was actually baptised.



At the more popular sites you can hire a minister (usually an evangelical American!) who will baptise you, or rebaptise you in the river. Everyone puts on long white gowns and then you enter into the river and you are tipped backwards with a full immersion and everyone claps and prays aloud. Of course in the Catholic church we only have the one baptism and this is usually as a child or baby too and we do not allow rebaptism. So certainly as a priest I really would not be allowed to have such a ceremony but I have to admit I am sorely tempted - I

would really see it as a renewal of my Baptism but if I am honest I would also enjoy it and like the photo opportunity for my own entertainment! But I still have to say I do like the dramatic nature of it all - it would stick in your memory. Do you know the date of your Baptism ? *Continued over page*

I can take a guess at the month and year of mine but have no memory of it as I was a little baby so I am a little jealous of such a marked celebration on offer at the River Jordan.

I think it really highlights the dramatic change we experience in Baptism - whether we receive this as adult or a child - nothing is the same for us ever again, we become a child of God, a child of light and a lifelong follower of the Lord. It really is a serious moment.

So today on this feast let us give thanks for our own Baptism and the change and difference it makes in our lives. We may not have the high drama of being baptised in the river Jordan but our Baptism marks a complete change in our lives as we received the grace and love God and the many gifts that we can use as a follower of Jesus in our daily lives.

Peace Sunday

Sunday 15th January, is Peace Sunday and this year the message from Pope Francis tells us: 'No one can be saved alone. Combatting Covid-19 together, embarking together on paths of peace'.

He asks us: 'What did we learn from the pandemic? What new paths should we follow to cast off the shackles of our old habits, to be better prepared, to dare new things? What signs of life and hope can we see, to help us move forward and try to make our world a better place?' A vaccine has been found for Covid-19, says the Holy Father, but we still need to tackle the virus of war, and of inequality, and this can only be done together.

In this country we have an active Catholic peace movement in Pax Christi, which aims at working together to promote peace through parishes, schools and social media. Our own Archbishop Malcolm is the president of Pax Christi and is very familiar with their work Their website suggests ways we can all become better peacemakers.
