English

During the summer term we will be focusing on two cores texts within Y1 - The Rabbit Problem and The Naughty Bus. We will continue to practise writing sentences by saying out loud what they we are going to write about. We will build and compose a sentence orally before writing. Y1 children will practise writing sentences and re-read what they have written to check that it makes sense. During the summer term children will develop their understanding of the following concepts: leaving spaces between words, jointing words/clauses using and, punctuation sentences using a capital letter and a full step. to use evolumetion marks and questions

<u>Science</u>

This term, we start by revisiting and reinforcing some of our previous topics, emphasising Working Scientifically and enquiry skills. After half term, we will be completing an exploratory unit on light; considering ways of making light reflections and

<u>Music</u>

Y1's first unit is called 'Having Fun with Improvisation!', where we will be learning songs that can help us through the day! After half term we will be exploring how we can create stories with sound!

Art

This term children will use drawing, painting and sculpture to develop and share their ideas, experiences and imagination. They will develop a wide range of art and design techniques in using colour, pattern, texture, line, shape, form and space. Pupils will become familiar with creating drawings using

In Spring term Year 1 will learn about peeling, zesting, cutting safely and applying these skills when preparing healthy dishes. Children will learn key information about healthy eating and where their food comes from. They will gain some practical ideas about ingredients that can be combined to make interesting


Come and See

Curriculum Enhancements

<u>Computing</u>

Maths

In Mathematics this term children will learn the following;

Multiplication – count in multiples of 2s, 5s and 10s **Halves and quarters** – To recognise, find and name half and quarters.

Position and direction - Describe position, direction and movement, including whole, half, quarter and three-quarter turns.

Numbers to 100 – count read and write numbers to 100 in numbers. Represent and use number bonds facts within 20.

Time – learn to tell the time to the hour and half past the hour and show these by drawing hands on a clock

P.E. Athletics & Dance

In summer term year 1 will be given the opportunity to master basic movements including running, jumping, throwing and catching, as well as developing balance, agility and co-ordination. They will learn and develop their dance skills and perform dances using
