

English

The Spider and the Fly – Children will complete character and setting descriptions and write a prequel stanza in style of the author. They will further explore journalistic writing and poetry.

Wonder – Children will write complete research and write an information leaflet about Treacher Collins Syndrome. They will write a recount in the form of a diary entry and do this from different points of view.

Science

Revision -This term we will start by revisiting and reinforcing some of our previous topics, emphasising Working Scientifically and enquiry skills.

Light - After half term we will completing a unit on Light, looking at the way light travels and how we see.

Music

How does music change our world? - In this unit, children will consider 'How Does Music Shape Our Way of Life?' They will continue to learn about all the Foundational Elements of Music with a focus on chords and structure.

Art

Drawing- Children will develop their ability to sketch using strategies such as the grid method. They will learn about negative and positive space and how this can help them to draw with more precision.

Design Technology

Electrical Systems – During this unit, children will make links with their scientific learning by designing and making their own board game. The game will include a circuit which will create light and/or sound.

Come and See

Pentecost Children will learn how the Feast of Pentecost is the celebration both of the gift of God's Holy Spirit and the trust God places in people to be witnesses in the world.

Reconciliation Through and in Christ, every human being is offered the power to reach out in forgiveness and peace, to receive and to offer reconciliation.

PSHE/RSE

In PSHE, the children will learn about different types of marriage and how it should be a free decision. Children will explore what is meant by enterprise and understand that pressure to behave in an unacceptable, unhealthy or risky way can come from a variety of sources.

Curriculum Enhancements

Maths

Percentages - Children will learn a range of strategies to find percentages of amounts. They will then apply these strategies to convert between percentages, decimals and fractions.

Measure – Children will generate the formulae for the area of triangles and parallelograms and the volume of cubes and cuboids and use them to calculate areas, volumes and missing lengths.

Geometry - Children will use a protractor, measure angles in shapes, and apply knowledge of shape properties to accurately draw them. This unit also exposes children to coordinates in all four quadrants for the first time.

P.E.

Athletics - In this unit, pupils are set challenges for distance and time that involve using different styles and combinations of running, jumping and throwing. Pupils think about how to achieve their greatest possible speed, distance or accuracy and learn how to persevere.

Rounders - Pupils develop the quality and consistency of their fielding skills and understanding of when to use them such as throwing underarm and overarm, catching and retrieving a ball.

French

Café Culture, Restaurants – Children will know how to order a meal in French and explain how to make a snack in French too.

Performance Time -Children will know how to answer questions about their personal information and how to express simple opinions in French.

History

The Slave Trade – In this unit, Year 6 will learn which countries were involved in The Slave Trade, the role of Liverpool during this period and how it was finally abolished.

Geography

United Kingdom – Children will compare the countries of the UK, study the UK's major cities, identify the physical characteristics of the UK, explore the UK's landscape and people and industries in the UK.
