Ideas for home learning and enrichment of the text

- Communication and Language**
- Enjoy sharing some other superhero themed stories, e.g. Supertato, Traction Man or Super Daisy.
- Personal, Social and Emotional Development**

- Physical Development**
- Design your own superhero obstacle course. How many circuits can you complete?

- Understanding of the World**
- Find out about some real life super heroes in our our world. Maybe your Mum or Dad help people in a hospital or care home, maybe they're part of the police or fire service?
- Expressive Arts and Design**
- Create a superhero cape and mask as a disguise. Think about a symbol to match your power or identity.
