## **Easter People**

All this week the Gospel readings at our midweek Masses have told the various accounts of Jesus's encounters with the disciples and his followers immediately after his resurrection. This has included the appearance to the disciples on their way to Emmaus which is one of my favourite Scripture passages. The disciples realised that their hearts 'burned within us' after they recognised Jesus at the breaking of the bread. Every Easter we recognise and welcome the renewal of the Risen Lord in our own lives. We pray that our hearts once again burn within us. Hearts of fire with faith and with care and love.

Allowing our hearts to burn would really change us into being Easter people. People with vision, love and trust in our hearts. I think any of us would say we want to be an Easter person but speaking personally I am also not sure I always make the cut. The companions at Emmaus immediately set out to share the Good News of the resurrection and took the risky night time journey back on the road to Jerusalem - at that time, night journeys were seen as risky and dangerous due to thieves, or violent attack, or simply hazardous in the dark - and yet that is what they did. As Easter people today are we willing to take the risk of helping the poor, welcoming the stranger, or thinking about how we can be the church we are called to be today. I know I want it, but I worry that it's challenging and outside my comfort zone at times. After the preparations of Lent and the immediate joys of the Easter celebrations we can enter into our Easter season, praying for our hearts to burn, so that we can truly become Easter people with the Light of the Lord burning in our hearts.

## Gift Aid

New envelopes are ready for collection for those who gift aid their parish donations. If your box is not there please speak to Jim and Mark at St Columba's or Fr Michael and Dave at St. John Fisher's and we will arrange for a box for you. As we come to the start of a new tax year can I ask if you can consider filling in a Gift Aid form if you regularly give to the parish and you pay tax. It is a simple form and your details will be kept confidential. Basically it means that we as the parish can claim from the government an extra 25p for every pound you donate at no extra cost to you. Forms are available at both churches or speak with the people above.

We also would encourage you to consider making your payments by standing order - it makes financial planning more simple and its also a more secure way of giving. Again forms are available at both churches



## Forthcoming Elections

In May we will be having local elections and of course the date of the general election at national level is constantly speculated about.
