


Nursery

Theme: Pupil's voice

Learning Objective: To say what I think.


After reading, the children worked in small groups and took turns expressing their choices and opinions, while also listening respectfully to their friends. This supported early communication skills and encouraged the children's sense of autonomy, giving them ownership over their ideas and helping them recognise that everyone's choices are valued.



Theme: Being tolerant of others.

L.O: To stand up to discrimination.

Year 6 explored what the word 'discrimination' means: After reading the book 'The Whisperer' by Nick Butterworth, we considered how it might feel to be different to everyone else around you and how you may not show your true-self due to fear of being treated differently.




Theme: Showing Empathy

Learning Objective: To recognise when someone heeds help.

Y5 read 'How to Heal a Broken Wing' and thought about showing empathy. They also learnt about the work of amnesty international and how some countries do not have

democracy or the right to protest.



#### Reception

Theme: Race

LO: To make friends with someone who is different.

The Reception children read a story about a blue chameleon. Through Blue Chameleon, the children learned that diversity is something to celebrate and that true friendship and acceptance come from embracing differences, whether they relate to race, appearance, or personality. We discussed how our differences make us special and how we can be friends with everyone. The key message in the story is that the chameleon doesn't need to change to find a friend. The children learned that we should respect others for who they are—regardless of their skin colour, background, or other differences. We also coloured in our own chameleons in various colours to celebrate diversity.
